

Creativity and Imagination:
Comic book

Age: 4 years





Activity description

The child is required to create 5 funny characters / toons / cartoons from any 5 HINDI alphabets.

Video in web resources section show how funny characters / toons / cartoons can be made using ENGLISH alphabets. The child has to apply the same creativity but using HINDI alphabets. Child may/may not colour the drawing.

Once the child is ready, click image(s) of the art work & submit. The art work can be done on one page or on multiple pages as desired by the child.

Management reserves the right to request a video of the child doing the art work in case the management feels the art work has not been done by the child.

Assessment guidelines

The total non-bonus points for this activity is 30. Every submission would be rated as either of below.

M = Master (100%) The child can draw 5 funny characters / toons / cartoons as instructed

The child can draw 3 funny characters / toons / cartoons as instructed

I = Intermediate (80%)

B = Beginner (50%)

The child can draw 1 funny character / toon / cartoon as instructed

For participating in the event & making an event relevant submission which does not meet assessment guidelines for M, I or B.

A = Aspirant (25%)

NA (Not applicable)

No submissions or any submission which is irrelevant for the activity.

50% bonus marks: If the child securing an M can draw 10 funny characters / toons / cartoons as instructed



Expert coach speaks

A comic strip is a sequence of drawings, often cartoon, arranged in interrelated panels to display brief humour or form a narrative, often serialized, with text in balloons and captions.

Strips are written and drawn by a comics artist, known as a cartoonist. As the word "comic" implies, strips are frequently humorous. But because "comic" strips are not always funny, cartoonist Will Eisner has suggested that sequential art would be a better genre-neutral name.

Traditionally, comic strips were published in Newspaper but have become popular as Webcomics as well.

The activity benefits in many ways:

- Conjure up excitement & imagination
- Allows telling own unique story
- Teaches how to use software applications
- Brings in perfection & precision of work

Common mistakes to avoid

• Do not make it serious for the child – let child's definition funny prevail
