#### **Activity description**

The child is required to speak any of the 7 sentences introducing self out of the 10 given sentences: (1) My name is \_\_\_\_\_ (2) I am a boy/girl (3) I am \_\_\_\_ years old (4) I live in \_\_\_ city (5) My father's name is \_\_\_\_ (6) My mother's name is \_\_\_\_ (7) I study in \_\_\_\_ school (8) I am in class \_\_\_ (9) I like \_\_ a lot (10) I want to become \_\_\_. The child has to speak in Sanskrit language with correct pronunciation.

All the sentences should be narrated from memory by the child & not read from anywhere nor prompted by any another person. All the sentences should be recorded in one go i.e. no separate recording for each sentence is allowed. No video editing software use is allowed.

Whenever the child is ready, record a video of the child speaking the sentences in Sanskrit & submit the video.

## Assessment guidelines

The total non-bonus points for this activity is 30. Every submission would be rated as either of below.

M = Master (100%) The child can speak any 7 sentences (out of given 10) in Sanskrit with correct pronunciation following all above instructions

The child can speak any 5 sentences (out of given 10) in Sanskrit with correct pronunciation following all above instructions

I = Intermediate (80%)

B = Beginner (50%)

The child can speak any 3 sentences (out of given 10) in Sanskrit with correct pronunciation following all above instructions

For participating in the event & making an event relevant submission which does not meet assessment guidelines for M, I or B.

A = Aspirant (25%)

NA (Not applicable)

No submissions or any submission which is irrelevant for the activity.

**50% bonus marks**: If the child securing an M can speak all the 10 sentences (out of the given 10) in Sanskrit with correct pronunciation following all above instructions
