
**Self-Learning Manual: Activity 18** 

**Cognitive skills:** 

**Excellence**

### **Activity description**

The child is required to write A to Z on a paper in small letters. The paper should be ruled paper. The child is required to write all 26 English alphabets. All small letters should be together. Depending on the paper size, the 26 letters can be written in one row or in 2-3 rows.

The child is expected to demonstrate perfect handwriting skills in this activity i.e. all the alphabets are of the correct & consistent, relative shape & size & are in a straight line i.e. all alphabets in a row are parallel to the boundary of the paper. In case of child writing the letters in multiple rows, each row is as perfectly parallel to each other as possible. The management retains the right to request a video of child doing the activity later if the management feels the writing was done by someone other than the child.

Click an image of the child's writing after the child has completed the activity. Submit entry.

## Assessment guidelines

The total non-bonus points for this activity is 30. Every submission would be rated as either of below.

M = Master (100%) The child can write all 26 alphabets in correct & consistent, relative shape & size and in a straight line as instructed

The child can write at least 15 alphabets in correct & consistent, relative shape & size and in a straight line as instructed

I = Intermediate (80%)

B = Beginner (50%)

The child can write at least one row of alphabets (any size) with min. 8 alphabets in correct & consistent, relative shape & size and in a straight line as instructed

For participating in the event & making an event relevant submission which does not meet assessment guidelines for M, I or B.

A = Aspirant (25%)

NA (Not applicable)

No submissions or any submission which is irrelevant for the activity.

**50% bonus marks**: If the child securing an M can write both Capital & Small alphabets (26X2) in correct & consistent, relative shape & size and in a straight line as instructed



### Expert coach speaks

One of your most important tasks as a parent is to teach your children skills that will help them excel in life. To achieve that, you have to teach your children to become quality producers.

- Don't let the line go down
