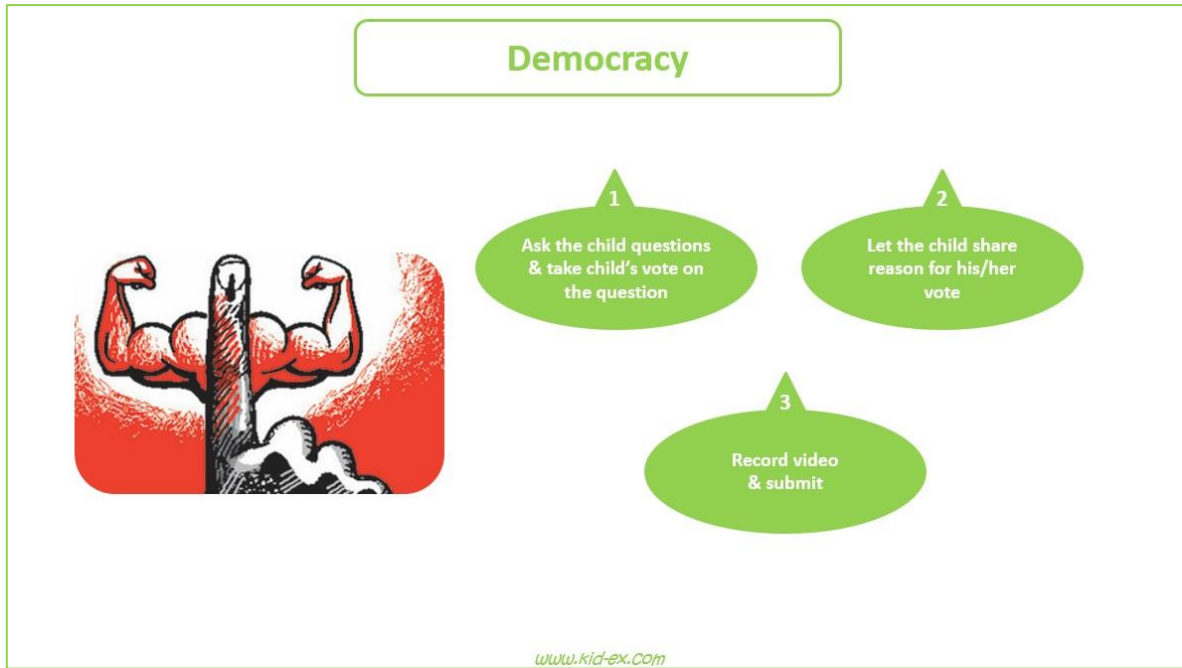

Self-Learning Manual: Activity 30

Socio Emotional:

Democracy

Age: 4 years



Activity description

Ask the child, on video, any 3 questions & ask the child to share his/her vote for the same (as Yes/No). For every response, the child should articulate why is the child voting Yes or No. The answer can be as simple as – “I don’t like something”. Aim is to help the child internalize the concept of voting & having a reason for the vote.

Entire video should be recorded at one go & no editing/video merging is allowed. No prompts are allowed to the child. Keep the total length of the video less than 4 minutes (even for EX). Record the video of the child as instructed & submit.

Assessment guidelines

The total non-bonus points for this activity is 30. Every submission would be rated as either of below.

M = Master
(100%)

The child can cast vote for 3 questions & share reasons for the vote for the responses

The child can cast vote for 3 questions & share reasons for the vote for at least 2 responses

I = Intermediate
(80%)

B = Beginner
(50%)

The child can cast vote for 3 questions & share reasons for the vote for at least 1 response

For participating in the event & making an event relevant submission which does not meet assessment guidelines for M, I or B.

A = Aspirant
(25%)

NA (Not applicable)

No submissions or any submission which is irrelevant for the activity.

50% bonus marks: If the child securing an M can cast vote for 4 questions & share reasons for the vote for all 4 responses

Expert coach speaks

Democracy refers to two forms of government: The most common form in which the people have the authority to choose their governing legislators and the original form in which the people have the authority to decide on legislation. The decisions on who is considered part of the people and how authority is shared among or delegated by the people have changed over time and at different speeds in different countries, but they have included more and more of the inhabitants of all countries. Cornerstones of Democracy include freedom of assembly and speech, inclusiveness and equality, membership, consent, voting, right to life and minority rights.



Key benefits of this activity

The activity benefits in many ways:

- Ensures development for all sections of society
- Helps understand needs of society as a whole
- Keep efforts in check & ensure right prioritization
- Helps understand how to apply power of democracy
- Creates responsible & vigilante citizens

Common mistakes to avoid

- *Do not pick all Yes or all No questions*
- *Do not make the Why too easy for the child – try to create a dilemma in the child's mind to help the child internalize the concept best*
