

KidEx Do-It-Yourself National Challenge 2020

Activity description and self-learning manual

Activity: Record 1 video speaking 2 words in 10 languages & submit | Language and Communication skills | 7-8 years

Skill development milestone

Reading skills become more sophisticated. Children of this age group are reading more for content now than to learn how to read. They acquire information through the media as well. They can give short oral reports. Also, they can read aloud and are reading more complex and longer books.

The child is using appropriate grammar in their speech and written work. They will improve pronunciation. He/she will ask questions to clarify information. They can write a story several paragraphs long on the same subject or an outline with a beginning, a middle, and an end.

He/she can use language at a higher level to make jokes, tease, engage in sarcasm, argue point of view, explain complex situations, talk about movies. They see that some words have more than one meaning. It helps them understand jokes and puns and start verbally expressing a sense of humor.

Children of this age group might start using slang and repeating things their friends said at school.

Activity description

The child is required to say the words “Hello!” and “Thanks!” in 10 different languages. The parent is required to record the child doing the activity or the child can record a selfie video as well.

The chosen 10 languages should include any 5 Indian languages (sample list provided as List 1) and 5 Global languages (sample list provided as List 2). You can write the word in chosen/multiple languages on a paper and hand it over to the child. Guide the child & read out the word aloud a few times to help the child understand the word & its pronunciation. You may play a short video/audio from the web/YouTube to help the child listen to the pronunciation of the word. Then, the parent should encourage the child to practice the different words one by one and ask for help/support wherever needed.

Let the child practice this over a few days naturally, during play session with parents, and sometimes, with prompting/guidance from parents. When the child is confident that the child can say the word “Hello!” & “Thanks!” in 10 languages at one go, please record video of the child completing its task. Ask the child to call out the language name first & then speak “Hello!” & “Thanks!” in that language while recording the video. Submit the video as an entry for the event.

Feel free to share the video with family, relatives and close friends as you desire. Or, post the videos on social media if you wish, with the hash tag #KidExDIYNationalChallenge.

Submission guidelines

1. You can record one common video of the child for this activity
2. Keep the total video size less than 20 MB
 - a. Higher resolution camera creates large size video files
 - b. Android users can install & use Camera MX player to record smaller size video files

 - c. Iphone users should change resolution setting by going to Settings -> Camera & selecting lowest resolution from "Record Video" option

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Self-learning manual

Common mistakes child & parents make in this activity are:

1. Not knowing your child's learning style. It varies from listening, speaking or reading.
2. Not starting from sounds. Sounds are the first step to learning a new language.
3. Getting discouraged by making mistakes. Practice is the key so find ways to not get bored or lose hope.
4. Child is not in the right mindset while learning. They will learn and enjoy the process if they are in a happy mood.

Key coaching tip to excel in this exercise is that use the word yourself in front of the child often (with right pronunciation) or play any YouTube video which introduces the word with correct pronunciation. Encourage the child to listen to the word and pronounce the word. Language requires a lot of repetition and reference experiences. Listening and speaking are much more effective ways to memorize and retain the learned language. It would also be helpful to incorporate the learned word in conversation since contextual memories will help the child remember it better.

Key benefits of this exercise:

1. Increases brain power. Learning a new language means your brain must cope with complexity as it makes sense of and absorbs new patterns.
2. Improves memory as it involves learning and recalling it multiple times. Multilingual people have brains that are more exercised and quicker to recall names, directions, facts, and figures.
3. It trains the brain to unlearn & learn things thus, improving learning skills in any individual.
4. Enhances the ability to multi-task.
5. Your first language improves as learning a new one makes you more conscious of the details of your first language.
6. It may help the child in other academic areas as well. As a result of higher cognitive skills, studies show that the benefits of learning a new language include higher scores on standardized exams in math, reading comprehension and vocabulary.

Entry evaluation guidelines

The maximum point for this activity is 10. Every entry would be rated as either:

1. Master (M): 100% score
 - a. The child can speak "Hello!" & "Thanks!" in 10 different languages with correct pronunciation (5 Indian, 5 Global) within 60 seconds without prompting of the actual word by anyone (though parents can encourage the child to remember other words & speak).
2. Intermediate (I): 80% score
 - a. The child can speak "Hello!" & "Thanks!" in 10 different languages with correct pronunciation (5 Indian, 5 Global) within 90 seconds without prompting of the actual word by anyone (though parents can encourage the child to remember other words & speak).
 - b. The child can speak "Hello!" & "Thanks!" in 10 different languages with correct pronunciation (any number of Indian or Global) within 60 seconds without prompting of the actual word by anyone (though parents can encourage the child to remember other words & speak).
 - c. The child can speak "Hello!" & "Thanks!" in 8 different languages with correct pronunciation (4 Indian, 4 Global) within 60 seconds without prompting of the actual word by anyone (though parents can encourage the child to remember other words & speak).
3. Beginner (B): 50% score
 - a. The child can speak "Hello!" & "Thanks!" in 10 different languages with correct pronunciation (any number of Indian or Global) within 90 seconds without prompting of the actual word by anyone (though parents can encourage the child to remember other words & speak).

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- b. The child can speak "Hello!" & "Thanks!" in 8 different languages with correct pronunciation (4 Indian, 4 Global) within 90 seconds without prompting of the actual word by anyone (though parents can encourage the child to remember other words & speak).
 - c. The child can speak "Hello!" & "Thanks!" in 6 different languages with correct pronunciation (3 Indian, 3 Global) within 60 seconds without prompting of the actual word by anyone (though parents can encourage the child to remember other words & speak).

Free version participants would be eligible for:

1. Assessment score for every submitted entry
