Self-Learning Manual: Activity 08 Creativity and Imagination: Face Mask

Age: 4 years

Activity description

The child is required to colour any full-face mask using crayons and/or water paint. The mask can be of any character - a cartoon, superhero, bird or an animal.

The child's parent may create the face mask & hand over to the child (refer web link resources section below to see quick / easy way to create simple full face masks). To make the mask use the material that is basic and readily available at home. The simplest of masks can be made using paper, scissors, paints /crayons, adhesive, pencil/marker, and a string/thread.

Let the child colour the mask and decorate it using at least 3 unique colours. The child can use any colouring material which is readily available at home.

Record a video of the child showing his/her mask, talking about how s/he coloured/painted/decorated the mask. Ask the child to point out & call out the correct name of at least three unique colours used in the mask by the child. Submit the video as per the guidelines.

Assessment guidelines

The total non-bonus points for this activity is 30. Every submission would be rated as either of below.

M = Master (100%) The child can colour the full-face mask completely using at least three unique colours & speak presenting the mask as instructed for at least 15 seconds

The child can colour the full-face mask mostly (>80%) using at least three unique colours & speak presenting the mask as instructed for at least 15 seconds

I = Intermediate (80%)

B = Beginner (50%)

The child can colour the full-face mask partially (>50%) using at least two unique colours & speak presenting the mask as instructed for at least 10 seconds

For participating in the event & making an event relevant submission which does not meet assessment guidelines for M, I or B.

A = Aspirant (25%)

NA (Not applicable)

No submissions or any submission which is irrelevant for the activity.

50% bonus marks: If the child securing an M can perform the task colouring the full face mask choosing appropriate colours & without merging different colours inappropriately



Expert coach speaks

Kids are highly creative by nature. They have an innate liking for all kinds of art forms, be it art, craft, drama, acting, singing etc. Art forms are vibrant and interesting. The kid is fascinated by colours, characters, and their varied representations. Colours never fail to excite the child and s/he encounters different characters in form of cartoons, super-heroes etc on the television or on things around them. The given activity brings colours and character together for the child and give her/him a chance to boost creativity in treating the two.



Key benefits of this activity

The activity benefits in many ways:

- Boosts creativity and imagination
- Exercises the left brain
- Provides a chance to step into another character
- Improve art and craft skill
- Provides a chance to articulate about a piece of art

Common mistakes to avoid

- S/he gets impatient and handles the mask roughly
- The child does not know the name of the colours
- The boundary of colours is crisscrossing multiple times
