












Activity description

The child is required to call out three differences between a horse & a zebra.

The idea behind the activity is to help the child think about differences between two similar objects/things which sets the thinking platform for judging pros & cons in subsequent years. At an early age, horse, zebra, donkey, mule, unicorn etc. may all be considered as same animal.

The child should call out 3 differences between both the animals.

Record a video of the child sharing her/his views and submit it as per the guidelines.

Assessment guidelines

The total non-bonus points for this activity is 30. Every submission would be rated as either of below.

M = Master (100%) The child can call out three correct differences between the two animals.

The child can call out two correct differences between the two animals.

I = Intermediate (80%)

B = Beginner (50%) The child can call out one correct difference between the two animals.

For participating in the event & making an event relevant submission which does not meet assessment guidelines for M, I or B.

A = Aspirant (25%)

NA (Not applicable)

No submissions or any submission which is irrelevant for the activity.

<u>50% bonus marks</u>: If the child securing an M can share three similarities between the two animals as well & cover all the six points (3 differences & 3 similarities) in less than 60 seconds.
