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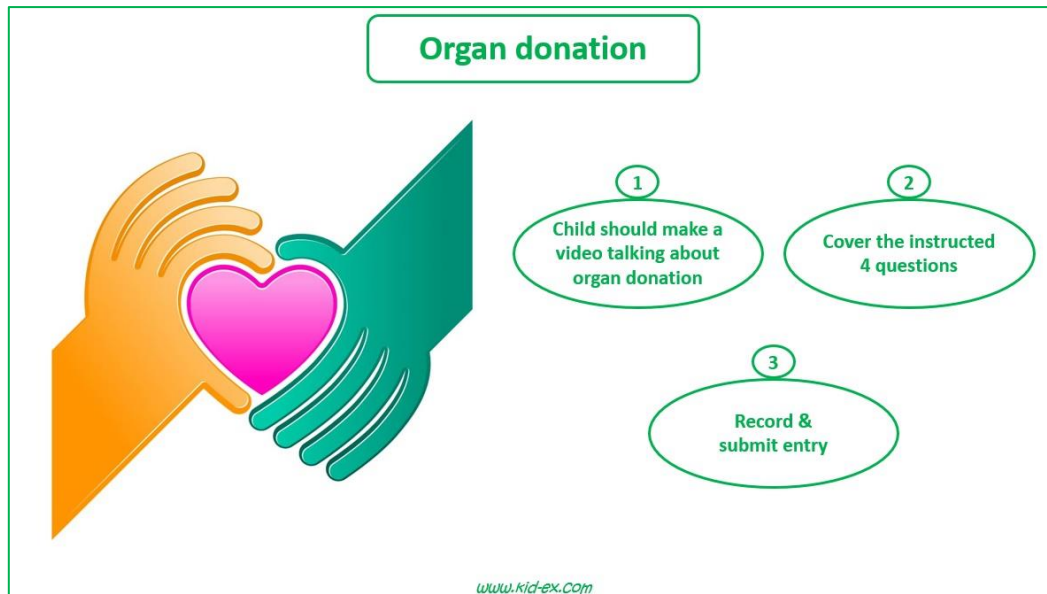

**Organ Donation**  
**Age: 5 years**

## Activity description

The child is required to share her/his views on Organ Donation. S/he must record a video of self-talking about the following points explaining:

- What is organ donation?
- Who can donate organs?
- Which organs can be donated?
- When can a person donate the organ(s)?

Let the child seek answers for the above questions and spend time thinking about the noble cause. Encourage the child ask as many questions as comes to child's mind. When all the queries of the child have been quenched, and the child is ready to record a video answering these questions (without any clues/prompts), record and submit a video of the child addressing the given questions.

## Assessment guidelines

The total non-bonus points for this activity is 30. Every submission would be rated as either of below.

**M = Master**  
(100%)

The child can cover all the 4 points in his/her video recording explaining them appropriately

The child can cover at least 3 points in his/her video recording explaining them appropriately

**I = Intermediate**  
(80%)

**B = Beginner**  
(50%)

The child can cover at least 2 points in his/her video recording explaining them appropriately

For participating in the event & making an event relevant submission which does not meet assessment guidelines for M, I or B.

**A = Aspirant**  
(25%)

**NA (Not applicable)**

No submissions or any submission which is irrelevant for the activity.

**50% bonus marks:** If the child securing an M can share any 2 common myths associated about Organ Donation as well.

### **Expert coach speaks**

### **Key benefits of this activity**

- Sensitizes the child about the noble cause of Organ Donation
- Promotes enquiry about concerns that matter to humanity at large
- Serves as an example to demonstrate that the most important of concerns can be explained through simple things
- Encourages her/him to take up a social cause and spread awareness about it
- Heightens the Emotional Quotient (EQ) of the child

#### **Common mistakes to avoid**

- *Thinking that the child is too young to understand the cause*
- *Not answering questions / curiosity induced in the child*
- *Providing wrong information*
- *Reading the presentation from a paper or using prompts*
- *Harbouring apathy for socio-emotional skills activity*
